## POPULATION

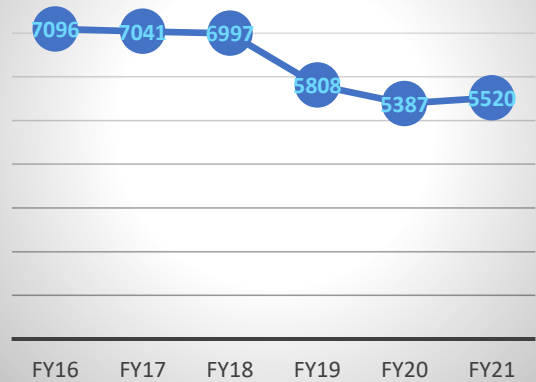
### Income

- 2%** reported experiencing homelessness
- 88%** households receive public assistance
- 60%** families receive Medicaid
- 83%** eligible families receive WIC

### Parents

- 3,187** or **58%** of families enrolled prenatally
- 2,580** families were either in school or at least employed part-time
- 2,071** families had pursued a degree post-high school
- 2,792** families were married or living together

## PROGRAM IMPACT

### Child Protection & Permanency (CP&P)

- 41%** families served have history with CP&P
- 13%** families were referred to CP&P FY21
- 99%** families did not have a substantiation with CP&P after enrollment with Home Visiting

### Intimate Partner Violence (IPV)

- 77%** families received IPV screenings
- 49%** positively screened families were referred to domestic violence services

### Child Development

- 79%** children receive timely developmental screenings
- 83%** families reported singing and reading to their child every day  
\*Statewide, only 46% of parents report reading and 52% singing to their child every day.
- 71%** families practice safe sleep methods with infants
