Statewide Coverage

Active in **all 95 Tennessee counties** via **17 Local Implementing Agencies (LIAs)**.

Targeted Delivery

82.8% of participating children are **≤2 years old**. **79.4%** of the adults are **19-34 years old**.

292 Home Visitors

Delivering 4 evidence-based models focused on priority, low-income, and at-risk populations.

State-Federal Partnership

80.2% State Funded, demonstrating strong state commitment backed by federal MIECHV reauthorization needs.

Prenatal Care Access

Processed **10,443 TennCare prenatal referrals**; connecting **2,415 families** to services.



93.0% of caregivers reported engaging in **DAILY LITERACY AND DEVELOPMENTAL ACTIVITIES** including reading, storytelling, and singing. The national average for FY25 was 83.0%



83.3% of mothers with a positive screen for **POSTPARTUM DEPRESSION** were **REFERRED** for mental health services. The national average for FY25 was 81.0%.



90.0% of infants were **BORN FULL TERM**, up 3% from SFY24.
9.3% of infants were **BORN PRE-TERM**, The national average for FY25 was 12.0%



75.2% of caregivers reporting tobacco use received **CESSATION REFERRALS** or information. The national average for FY25 was 41.0%.



88.0% of primary caregivers were **SCREENED** for intimate partner violence.
100% of those identified **RECEIVED REFERRALS** for services. The national average for FY25 was 42.0%.



30.0% (up 3.4% from SFY24) of primary caregivers without a high school diploma at the time of EBHV enrollment **CONTINUED SCHOOL OR GRADUATED**, The national average for FY25 was 28.0%.
